Maternal Mortality in the U.S. Far Outstrips That of Other Industrialized Nations



The Uneven Burden of U.S. Maternal Mortality

The Challenge: Maternal Mortality Impacts Babies



Poor birth outcomes

- Texas has one of the nation's highest rates of poor birth outcomes (preterm birth rate of 10.8% statewide, 14.6% for Black mothers in Texas).
- 1 in 9 babies are born too soon in Texas.

Childhood obesity

- In Texas alone, obesity costs businesses \$11 billion per year, and that is expected to reach \$30 billion by 2030.
